The Immanuel Wreath Christmas Advent Ideas

Your family can create your own Immanuel Wreath traditions—here are some of our favorite ways to make the Christmas season more meaningful:

Light 1 Candle Each Night - Dec. 1 - 25

- Gather as a family and light 1 candle each night.
- While the flame shares its light, have a family member read the name of Christ and the scripture related to that candle.
- Invite a family member to share how that name describes how the Savior has shown up in her/his story this past year.

Light Candles as You Go - Dec. 1 - 25

- Gather as a family and start by lighting candles from all previous days, then light the candle for that specific day.
- Read the name of Christ and scripture associated with that day's candle.
- Invite a family member to share a personal experience with Christ related to that name.
- For example, on Day 3, you would start by lighting the candles from Day 1 (Living Christ) and Day 2 (Jehovah). Then as you light the candle for Day 3 (Messiah), you would focus on the scripture and personal story related to Messiah. By Day 25, all 25 candles will be lit as you discuss the final name, Divine Son.

One-Day Event

If your family is getting together for just one night, you can:

- Option 1 Light all 25 candles and read all 25 names and scriptures.
- Option 2 Ask each family member to pick one name that is most meaningful to them. As they light their candle, have them read that name and scripture, and share why that name is particularly meaningful to them this year.
- You might end up with just a handful of the candles lit, but they will be special, as they are specific to your family stories.
